Many times I drove the Ridge Road across Niagara County to Lewiston and then turned South down the oddly rigid Robert Moses Parkway to get to my beloved trails in the Niagara Gorge. The incredible power of Niagara Falls and the Niagara Gorge drew tourism and industry to our home decades ago, and also made many a politician and business person go "crazy" with a desire to capitalize on this remarkable natural resource. Up on the "high bank," as they called the Gorge cliff near the falls on the American side, the industrial revolution first took hold in our country during the 19th century. The hydro mechanical power, and later the hydro electric power of Niagara was the rocket fuel that enabled our country's sudden technological leap over the other more established nations of the world. This leap ushered in an unprecedented ecological disaster to our sacred Onnguiaahra, the Falls and Gorge. Robert Moses was oblivious to ecology and the sacred aspects of life. He simply wanted to build monuments to industry and to himself. There's not enough room here for me to describe the destruction of wonderful now-forgotten places like Milk Cave that the construction of the "Parkway" brought about. I vote to remove the road, and restore this beautiful stretch of land to a more natural state limiting automobile access as much as possible. It is time to create a park that will cause our grandchildren to admire our resolve to correct the errors of the past and bring real value to the homeowners of Niagara Falls.
